

# Introduction

This year's Financial Summary is set within the context of one of the biggest crises the modern world has faced.

The second half of the financial year ending 31 July 2020 was dominated by tackling the consequences of Covid-19. The safety of our students, staff and community remained our overriding priority. It was our focus from the outset of the pandemic and has guided every part of our response to date.

Philanthropy has been central to this response. Our ask to alumni, friends, parents and donors to support our St Andrews Covid-19 Appeal Fund was the first by a Scottish university, and the response was overwhelming, with over £1m raised to support students in need, research and our local community.

The University's fundamental goal through the pandemic is to continue to deliver excellence in teaching and research, so attracting the best staff and the most promising students from around the world, providing a safe and welcoming environment in which they can produce their best work for maximum societal benefit.

The philanthropic support of our community has continued to be dedicated to this goal. Among other things, this year saw the completion of the Laidlaw Music Centre and the extension to the award-winning Wardlaw Museum. Philanthropy is also being invested in the development of the Mackenzie Institute, which is currently working on a number of key Covid-19 related research projects. Undergraduate and postgraduate Scholarships also remain a priority.

We are now in the planning stages of the creation of a new comprehensive campaign for the University of St Andrews. We have completed our feasibility study and are now articulating our new case for support. 

Total income increased across the year, despite Covid-19, which impacted the underlying results with St Andrews being one of the first universities in the UK to release students from their accommodation contracts at the start of the national lockdown. This, together with the loss of summer conferences, hotel accommodation and sports memberships to lockdown restrictions, also hit the University significantly, resulting in a reduction to accommodation-related revenues of £4.4m income. This, in part, was offset by reduced other operating expenditure and £2.9m from the UK Government's Coronavirus Job Retention Scheme. Capital donations of £3.1m were also received, with £2.3m towards the new custom-designed Laidlaw Music Centre.



Although total expenditure has decreased by 23.4% or £54.1m, this is predominantly due to pension accounting adjustments relating to our two staff pension schemes. Excluding these pension movements, and the Biomedical Sciences building fire expenditure of £11.9m, underlying expenditure has increased by £6.9m to £245.3m mainly driven by increased staff costs.

# **Student numbers**







#### **Student numbers**






## Student numbers by region 2019-2020



# **Tuition fee income**

Undergraduate and postgraduate fees are set using different criteria to reflect the fact that undergraduate fees for Scottish and EU students are set externally by the Scottish Government, while postgraduate fees are set by the University within the context of prevailing market conditions.




# **Endowment investment**


Although Covid-19 inevitably had a major impact on investment values for the year, our net investment values increased by £3.2m and our combined endowment funds have grown by 7.6%. This exceeded our target of CPI +4% which was put in place to enable us to continue to spend while protecting the endowment capital.

## **Covid-19 impact and response**

Following the immediate shock of the Covid-19 pandemic and the projected economic fall-out for the University and wider society, the focus of Development switched to short-term needs, while all external meetings and events were cancelled. The Development unit responded with the launch of our Covid-19 appeal, in collaboration with colleagues across the University. St Andrews was the first Scottish university to launch a Covid-19 appeal and over £1M was raised by 31 July 2020, while other fundraising continued for priority projects, with fundraising staff switching to on-line engagement while working from home.




